The "NEW AND PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS LUNCHEON" took place at Saint Bedes Church on October 28th. Members and their guests were treated to a concert of music by J.S. Bach, played by the Los Angeles Recorder Orchestra, led by conductor Thomas Axworthy. The photo on the left shows Axworthy answering questions from the audience about the many sizes and shapes of the recorders, how they are made, the history of the recorders and how he became interested in them.



The players showed us their instruments and answered our many questions. The largest recorder looked to be about 7 feet high but was able to be broken down to fit into a case. The smallest recorder was the size of a piccolo. In Europe, the recorders are often made from plastic. If you closed your eyes, it was hard to distinguish these instruments from woodwinds or reed instruments.



The Los Angeles Recorder Orchestra is one of a growing number of recorder orchestras that have sprung up in Europe and around the United States in recent years. This orchestra was founded in 2004 and is made up 30 recorder players from all around Southern CA.

Another wonderful Mozaic Festival in San Luis Obispo was experienced by 19 COPW members and their guests. Rea Crane, Annette Colfax and Babs Rubens all facilitated our trip. We returned to the very comfortable La Cuesta Inn for our stay from July 28-30 this year.



We kicked off the weekend on Friday evening at Buona Tavola with a sumptuous dinner prior to our event for the evening. It was right next door at the recently renovated 75 year old Art Deco Fremont Theater. The theme was the Jazz Age. There was a segment of a piano/violin jazz duo followed by 3 very unique silent movies accompanied by a string quartet

and piano. Ben Ullery, Asst. Principal Viola at the LA Phil, was a member of the quartet.

Saturday began with a delicious lunch in the patio at NOVO Restaurant followed by an



afternoon at leisure for sightseeing, shopping, wine tasting or simply taking it easy.

At 5:30 we regrouped at Cuesta College where we began with a Notable Encounter Insight event "On Stage with Strauss." .. Scott Yoo the Music Director of the Festival, led this educational event. He did a wonderful job providing background about the evening performance of Metamorphosis. He and 6 other string players performed parts of what would be played by 24 players later that evening.



Of special interest was the back-story on what Strauss was experiencing during World War II when he composed the piece and that each member of the larger (24) chamber orchestras had a different score.

We stayed at Cuesta College for a "Picnic in the Patio" dinner and then attended the evening performance, which had enhanced resonance due to the earlier tutorial.

We also heard Copeland's Clarinet Concerto and Mendelssohn's Symphony #5 in D, op.107 "Reformation"

2016-2017 Summary

Subscription Chair, Ed Hirsch. For the 2016-2017 season COPW had a total of 116 subscriptions to WDCH and the HB. Including individual tickets purchased, the Braille Fund donations and the Toyota Symphonies for Youth donations, the total amount of support to the L.A. Phil through tickets was \$109,520.50.

Friends Campaign Chair: Inez Lopez. COPW members contributed an incredible total of \$47,365 to help fund LAPA operations.

Membership Chair. Susan Bell. We added eight new members to COPW this year. COPW was the affiliate with the most new members and was awarded a prize of 10 bench seats to the Hollywood Bowl at the Spring Celebration.

Volunteer Activities Chair: Sandy Beckley. **Pasadena Showcase House:** COPW volunteers worked 25 shifts which provided us with a \$1,000 donation. In addition COPW is credited with an additional \$1,500 given by COPW volunteers in lieu of working as volunteers. Total to LA Phil: \$2,500.

Toyota Symphonies for Youth: Becky Novy. 32 COPW members volunteered 64 hours of time for the pre-program activities.

YOLA Holiday Gift Drive: Elaine Berman. While this was an all affiliate event COPW members took the lead in purchasing and wrapping most of the 665 gifts that were distributed to all three youth orchestras. The total amount of affiliate donations was \$8,067, with \$2,427 coming from COPW.

HOLA/YOLA Book Sale: Elaine Berman. A total of 75 books were purchased new and sold to COPW members at the June 3 Installation Luncheon. The books sold for \$10/book and the purchaser could write their name on a specially designed and produced name plate in the front of each book. Additional gently used books were donated by COPW members.
